This is a short and sweet Christmas service for young children – suitable for a community Christmas service, carol evening or Christmas Eve Story Time.

- If scheduled for Christmas Eve, you might like to make it a pyjama party!
- © Make it an informal, welcoming atmosphere provide cushions & bean bags for seating on the floor
- Have Christmas colouring or activity sheets to hand out at the end

Invite all the children to gather at the front.
